



There are only a few reasons your landlord can evict you right now

**You cannot be evicted for not paying rent
for COVID-19-related reasons, under federal and
state eviction orders, until June 30, 2021**

**You still may be evicted
if you cause an immediate and substantial risk to
health, safety or property***

**You are still responsible to pay your rent.
If you do not pay, you will owe a lot more later!**

**The federal order likely prohibits a landlord evicting you so they can move in or sell.*

**If you cannot pay all your rent,
your landlord should offer a reasonable payment plan in writing.**

If your landlord tries to evict you, try to get legal help right away.
